#### **Staff News**

#### **An Eventful Week**

With many of the usual events and competitions postponed or cancelled throughout this year, it has been a real joy to be having a variety of events at school this week; some new and some modified to meet COVID safe requirements. Twenty-one students have been working in three teams to present their solution to a problem for this year's Tournament of Minds competition.
