Safety Reminders

Being COVID-safe: We start the term with the same COVID-safe practices and routines that were in place at the end of last term.

- Only students and staff are to enter the school beyond the school car parks and drop off/pick up areas. Parents can visit the school office if necessary.
- Weekly chapels will continue as K-2 and 3-6 groups. Assemblies will not be held at this time.
- Students who are unwell must not come to school (and if they have cold/flu symptoms they must be COVID tested and receive a negative test result, have no symptoms and advise the principal before returning to school).
- Good hand hygiene and sneeze/cough etiquette is to be practised at all times.
- Adults are to practise physical distancing at all times.

Sun Safety: With summer coming, please ensure your child brings their school hat each day. Please also teach children how to safely and effectively apply sunscreen before coming to school. Sunscreen is made available at school for the children to apply themselves. If your child has an allergy to particular brands of sunscreen, please write a note to the class teacher and send appropriate sunscreen to school with your child.

Being Allergy Aware: Due to the presence of children in our school who have severe allergies to particular foods, parents are asked to be mindful when packing lunches for their own children. Please do not include the following with your school lunches: peanuts and peanut products such as peanut butter, whole egg such as boiled eggs, egg sandwiches or omelettes.

TEAM 6 NEWS


Preparations are underway for our LSWW Walkathon on Friday 6 November. This event is being led by our Team 6 students as an act of service for the school.
