Reminders

Enrolment in 2021: To help us plan for next year, it is essential that parents advise the school as soon as possible if they are not returning to LSWW in 2021. The school requires at least sixty days' notice if a student is not continuing here.

Sun Safety at School: Lutheran School is an active Sunsmart School through the Cancer Council, so we encourage parents to send their children to school wearing sunscreen each day and to have their hat in their bag ready for outside play.



Kindergarten students learnt traditional face painting last Friday as part of their NAIDOC week celebrations and have been practising and learning about coins and notes that are used in Australia.


















OSHC NEWS


