
Dear parents and caregivers

<u>This week's video</u> includes a snippet of thanks from our Lollipop Crossing Guard, Allan. He wants to thank Lutheran School parents and children for their respectful compliance with the pick-up and drop-off procedures. It allows him to do his job well to keep all our students safe.

The conversation with Allan reminded me of the model that we want to set for students. We don't follow rules because we're afraid of 'getting in trouble'. We follow the rules because it is the right thing to do. When we honour procedures, we help others in ways that we may not fully understand. We want behaviour to be intrinsically motivated.

If you haven't recently had a look at our <u>Behaviour Learning Policy</u>, I encourage you to do that. Our approach aims to foster students' understanding of how their behaviour choices affect others. It's okay for students to feel the myriad of emotions that we humans all feel. How can we intrinsically know that the behaviour choices we make (when we feel bored or angry or jealous or excited..) will affect others around us? Below are some illustrations of what our Restorative Practice looks like.

We thank you for partnering with us in helping raise intrinsically-motivated children who demonstrate our common values. Janet Moeller

Mathematical Olympiad and Games

How to enrol in Valuing Safe Communities: Online Training Module

Please note that this is a two-stage process which is required to ensure the integrity and safety of the training content. The first stage is registering on the training system: iLearn (steps 1 - 6) and the second stage is enrolling in the training module (steps 7 & 8).

Step 1

Copy (or cut and paste) the iLearn web address below into your internet browser: http://vscvolandrs.lutheran.edu.au

Step 2

Click on this button. Create new account

Step 3

Complete the registration form, including the fields under the title 'Valuing Safe Communities'. If the fields are hidden, click on the title ('Valuing Safe Communities') to reveal them, otherwise select your site.

Step 4

Click on this button.

Step 5

Check your inbox for an email from "iLearn Support" <<u>ilearnsupport@alc.edu.au</u>>Subject: iLearn – Australian Lutheran College: account confirmation If you can't see it in your inbox, check your junk or spam folder. Click on the **confirmation link** contained in the email.

Step 6

After you click the confirmation link in the email, iLearn opens to confirm your registration.

Step 7

OSHC NEWS


