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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear parents and caregivers

[This week's video](#) includes a snippet of thanks from our Lollipop Crossing Guard, Allan. He wants to thank Lutheran School parents and children for their respectful compliance with the pick-up and drop-off procedures. It allows him to do his job well to keep all our students safe.

The conversation with Allan reminded me of the model that we want to set for students. We don't follow rules because we're afraid of 'getting in trouble'. We follow the rules because it is the right thing to do. When we honour procedures, we help others in ways that we may not fully understand. We want behaviour to be intrinsically motivated.

If you haven't recently had a look at our [Behaviour Learning Policy](#), I encourage you to do that. Our approach aims to foster students' understanding of how their behaviour choices affect others. It's okay for students to feel the myriad of emotions that we humans all feel. How can we intrinsically know that the behaviour choices we make (when we feel bored or angry or jealous or excited..) will affect others around us? Below are some illustrations of what our Restorative Practice looks like.

We thank you for partnering with us in helping raise intrinsically-motivated children who demonstrate our common values.

Overarching Principle

...that people are more engaged and cooperative and more likely to make positive changes in their behaviour when those in positions of authority do things *with* them rather than to them or *for* them.

Traditional Response

The non-participatory nature of the punitive process encourages a tendency to focus on the wrongs experienced by the wrongdoer, diverting attention from the harm done to the wronged...with the wrongdoer focusing on their own plight...failing to see the real human costs of what they have done.

Restorative Response

Without an intrinsic link between the act and the effect on others, true accountability is hardly possible. The wrongdoer has the responsibility to name their part in the harm, listen empathetically to the person that has been harmed and be involved in making things right.

Real accountability includes an opportunity to:

- Understand the human consequences of one's acts
- Face up to what one has done and to whom one has done it
- Be allowed and encouraged to help decide what will happen to make things right
- Take steps to repair the damage

It involves taking responsibility for the results of one's behaviour

"I'm sorry" is a statement
"I won't do it again" is a promise
"How do I make it up to you?" is taking responsibility and taking action

Traditional Questioning

What happened?

Who is to blame?

What punishment should be given TO the perpetrator?

Restorative Questioning

What happened?

What were you thinking/feeling when it happened?

Who/what has been harmed?

How have they been affected?

What steps do you need to take to fix the problem?

Mathematical Olympiad and Games

OSHC NEWS






