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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

<u>This week's video message</u> is based on a podcast that inspired me earlier this year. *Freakonomics* podcast featured an episode called <u>In Praise of Incrementalism</u>. What do Renaissance painting, the American Civil Rights Movement and Olympic bicycling have in common? None of them happened all at once. Rather, the big changes happened as a result of smaller events (little 1% changes) that result in exponential growth over time.

The podcast is made for adults, but the message to students is the same: The little gains you make in reading, mathematics, music and sport seem small, but they result in tremendous growth over the seven years of primary school.

If there are changes you want to make as a family, consider negotiating a 1% change at a time. For example, you might negotiate five fewer minutes on the iPad each night to take a walk around the block. A week later, you might do 10 minutes less screen time and walk two blocks. What 1% changes can you think of that can make a big difference long term?




SRC News - Nude food lunch day

ICAS Assessments

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition. Every student will receive a printed certificate and an online result report. We encourage you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year. The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment.

ICAS Assessments are now online. This allows greater accessibility for students and faster delivery of results.


