QUICK PICK-UP REMINDERS FOR PARENTS

- 1. **STAY IN YOUR VEHICLE:** Parents must remain in their vehicles at all times. The pick-up zone is designed for quick and efficient student loading.
- 2. **DISPLAY YOUR FAMILY NAME**: Ensure your child's family name is clearly visible on the dashboard or windshield to help staff quickly identify and bring your child to your vehicle.
- 3. **FOLLOW STAFF INSTRUCTIONS:** Pay attention to staff members directing traffic and follow their instructions promptly to maintain a smooth flow.
- 4. **KEEP MOVING FORWARD**: As cars ahead of you move forward, continue to move up in the line. Do not stop or leave gaps in the line unless instructed by staff and please don't cut in front of others.
- 5. **NO MOBILE PHONE USE:** For the safety of all students and staff, refrain from using your cell phone while in the pick-up zone.
- 6. **HAVE IDENTIFICATION READY (Just in case)**: If asked, be prepared to show proper identification to staff members to ensure the safety of all students.
- 7. **LOAD AND UNLOAD CURB SIDE WHERE POSSIBLE**: Ensure your child enters and exits the vehicle from the curb side only to avoid accidents or interference with moving traffic.
- 8. **BE PATIENT:** The safety of all children is the priority. Please be patient and courteous to staff and other parents.
- 9. **ARRIVE ON TIME:** The bell goes at 3.20pm and so it takes at least another 2-3 minutes for students to make their way to the southern carpark. Please do not arrive early as you are only adding to the build-up of traffic.
- 10. **DO NOT BLOCK DRIVEWAYS OR EXITS**: Avoid blocking any driveways, exits, crossings or other vehicles while waiting in line.
- 11. **PREPARE FOR QUICK LOADING**: Make sure your child is aware of the process and ready to enter the vehicle quickly when your turn comes.
- 12. **NO PARKING IN PICK UP ZONE**: The pick-up zone is for active loading only. If you need to park and wait for any reason, please use the designated parking area near the front office.

THE PICK-UP ZONE IS STAFFED UNTIL 3:35 PM. AFTER THIS TIME, YOUR CHILD WILL BE ESCORTED TO THE BUS STOP WAITING AREA NEAR THE LIBRARY. TO COLLECT YOUR CHILD,

PLEASE PARK IN THE MIDDLE CARPARK AND WALK TO THE WAITING AREA.

FOR SAFETY, DO NOT WAVE YOUR CHILD ACROSS THE PARKING LOT
